Edward Joseph and Susan Marie (Chapatte) Montague passed away on April 24, 2025, due to health complications. Ed and Sue had a wonderful marriage lasting over fifty years. They were inseparable, always smiling, always supporting each other, always helping others along life's journey.

accomplished chef, Sue loved to prepare elegant feasts for family and friends. She would always create tasty treats for any family event, neighborhood celebration, or her nephew's and niece's sporting events. Sue

was also an avid San Francisco Giants fan.

Ed and Sue met in Hawaii. They quickly became inseparable. After Ed's active duty, they

moved to San Diego and lived in El Cajon and then Santee. Their home was populated with

herbs (for Sue's recipes), flowers, and bird feeders for the local avian community. They

spent many hours relaxing while the local hummingbirds feasted on the flowers. Ed and

Sue were passionate about giving of themselves to numerous San Diego-based and

national charities.
