Fusako “Fusa” Adachi of San Diego, CA, left her earthly body on January 13, 2024, a few months shy of her 94th birthday, after infection complications led to pneumonia.

Fusa was born in 1930 in the Hawaiian islands. As a child, she loved collecting seashells on Hawaii’s beautiful beaches, and later started stamp collecting. Fusa, a high school graduate in Kaneohe, started working on the family farm, and later worked as a waitress, did sales, and most importantly to her family, was a devoted mother & homemaker. When doctors couldn't help her asthmatic son, she studied nutrition and natural remedies and permanently cured him. She also enjoyed gardening and even taught herself finance. She was also known for her New Year's Day feasts made up of a dozen delicious dishes from Japanese, Hawaiian and American cuisines, often spending a full week or more in preparation.

After living in Los Angeles for several years, she moved to San Diego in the late 60s. Predeceased by her husband Jiro in 2007, Fusa is survived by all of her children, grandchildren & great-grandchildren. She lived a positive,

generous and honorable life, and she is blessed to be in a higher realm.
