“ I served under Cape. Metze in 1965-66 when he was head of the Fleet Training Branch of Bureau of Naval Personnel, and I was Program Manager for Submarine and Nuclear Power Training. He was a natural leader, a good friend, and a role model, representing all that was best in the Naval officer corps. Some years later I was a civil trial lawyer in San Diego and he was on on the panel of prospective jurors—doing his civic duty—for a case I was trying. The Judge asked the panel the standard question whether any of them knew any of the parties or lawyers, and with a big grin on his face, Capt. Metze said he knew me. The Judge asked if that might affect his judgment in this case. With an even bigger grin, he said "I'm sure it would," and with that, the Judge excused him. I could only grin back, because we couldn't talk. But I really wanted to sit down and have a beer with him. Sadly, that's the last time I ever saw him. A good man, who inspired others. May he rest in peace.
