



## Subrata Choudhuri

Subrata Choudhuri, born January 3, 1955, passed away peacefully in California surrounded by the care and compassion of hospice staff who eased him through his final moments.

Subrata's life was shaped early by profound loss. His mother died when he was only a toddler, leaving him without memories of her tenderness or presence.
